Prayer Diagram VII Forgive us our sins II notes

Matthew 6:9-13

- -- This is a humiliating prayer, and humility is what we need.
- --We are being shaped, we are being changed, we are having God's agenda become our agenda; God's teachings become our way of thinking.
- --"<u>Hallowed be Thy name"</u> do we take away any of His glory when we don't do that? Is glory dependent on our acknowledgment of it?
- -- "Thy kingdom come" So if we don't pray it seek it, will it stop is from coming?
- -- "Thy will be done" If we dig in our heals and refuse God's will, will that stop Him?
- -- "Give us this day our daily bread" -- if we don't ask will He withhold it?
- -- "Forgive us our sins" if we don't pray it won't happen?
- --<u>We have a tendency to get confused</u>—it's the constant state of sheep, so our Good Shepherd has to constantly lead us and watch over us.
- --<u>One of the main ways He watches over us is through prayer</u>—He's leading us and teaching us through prayer
- We wake up in a new world every day and forget and become confused about who is supposed to be glorified
- —We forget and become confused about the priority of His coming kingdom
- --We forget and become confused about who's will is superior
- —-<u>We forget and become confused</u> about <u>who meets all our needs</u>—Our bellies are full and we think we don't need a shepherd anymore.
- —-We forget and become confused our sin and God's forgiveness—We clean our lives up and think we don't live off of forgiveness every day.
- --Sin is the **greatest danger** that we face because it brings eternal destruction, thus, **the greatest need** we have is forgiveness. God offers that!
- --In fact, He more than offers it: Psalm 86:5
- --Forgiveness is having your debts to Almighty God canceled
- --Debt is slavery—John 8:34
- Our debts are unpayable; even an eternity in Hell will not pay them off.
- --Every time we sin, we accumulate more debt Romans 2:5 --God is willing to forgive our debts against Him.
- --<u>Forgiveness means to take away sin or remove it and laying</u> it on Jesus and then punishing Him for it: <u>Isaiah 53:6</u>
- --Forgiveness is covering sin: Psalm 85:2
- --Forgiveness is removing the record of our sin from the record: Isaiah 43:25
- --Only God can forgive sins because only the creditor can forgive the Debtor.
- --No one can forgive the sins against you except you yourself
- -- We are going to be talking about our forgiveness of others in coming weeks and you don't want to miss that.

- --God is not obligated to forgive
- --<u>He has chosen to forgive us</u>. <u>We, on the other hand, have no choice</u> but to forgive those who sin against us.
- --<u>Ultimately, only God can forgive sin, nobody else!</u>
 But that is exactly what He has done:

 <u>Colossians 2:13-14</u> He nailed it all to the cross.
- --<u>Do you remember that they nailed an indictment against</u> Jesus to the cross above His head? "This is Jesus of Nazareth. King of the Jews."
- --<u>But they had not right to say what He was hanging there for,</u> but God did and He nailed our sins there.
- --No one could do that for us, only God: Hebrews 10:12; 14 He has done it all, for all time, for all sin, once for all, and sat down since His work of forgiveness was complete.
- -- The Judge Himself has declared us not guilty; therefor, our position with God cannot change or be altered.
- --<u>So, why do we have to keep asking forgiveness?</u> Sin no longer effects our standing with God but it does affect our relationship.
- --God is not about Judicial proceedings as much as He's about relationships and fellowship.
- --<u>Jesus says that when we accept Him that</u>: <u>John 14:23</u> --its about relationship and fellowship way before it is about justice and right and wrong.
- --<u>When we sin, we don't damage our standing with God</u> because our standing is in Christ but we grieve God who forgave us so that we could be His.
- --<u>If all that was at stake was our standing with God, then</u> there would be no need to ask for forgiveness,
- --<u>Again, our standing with God is a means to</u> an end for Him, relevant only because it keeps Him from the possibility of relationship with us.
- -- The Heart of God is a relationship with us that is not hampered by out rebellion.
- --God hates sin because it is robbing Him of what He wants the most.
